

Summary of Rules for the Kansas Voluntary Exclusion Program

Pursuant to K.A.R. 112-112-4-9, the following rules shall apply to those interested in enrolling in the Voluntary Exclusion Program (VEP):

VEP Enrollment:

- A person may sign up for the VEP at any Kansas Lottery Gaming Facility or at the Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission office in Topeka.
- Individuals may select the length of exclusion: Two years or lifetime
- Completing a request for Voluntary Exclusion may result in your being denied service at affiliated casinos in other states or locations. For example, if an operator of a Kansas casino owns or manages a casino in another state, that operator may choose to deny a VEP participant at all its locations
- Employees of Kansas casinos are permitted to enter a casino for the purpose of carrying out the duties of their employment. The KRGC must be notified prior to starting a job at the casino.
- All participants must sign a waiver and release discharging the state from liability.

Placement on the VEP:

- If an individual signs up for the program, their name will appear on a list of excluded persons, which is confidential. The list will be distributed to the managers of Kansas casinos only for the purposes of enforcement.
- Any person participating in the program will agree to refrain from entering the gaming area of all Kansas casinos.
- It is the responsibility of the individual signed up for the VEP to stay away from Kansas casinos and not the responsibility of the KRGC or the casino manager to keep the individual away.
- If found in Kansas casino, the person will be asked to leave and will be subject to arrest for criminal trespassing.
- Participants must surrender any jackpot or thing of value won as a result of a wager made at a casino.
- Participants in the VEP will not have check cashing or ATM withdrawal privileges at Kansas casinos
- All casinos must cease direct marketing efforts to a person participating in the program

Removal from the VEP:

- A person enrolled for two years may request removal from the list at the expiration of that time period by completing a Request for Removal Application.
- A person applying for removal from the VEP must first undergo a problem gambling assessment by a Kansas Certified Gambling Counselor and complete a Healthy Lifestyle Choices curriculum before the application will be considered for removal
- The Kansas Racing and Gaming Commission will have the final determination on whether an applicant can come off the Voluntary Exclusion list.
